



Emma (Ocie) Taylor Songer Collection

1880-1979

49 textual records, 26 photographs, 2 oral history interviews, 1 artifact, 2 Albums

The Emma (known as Ocie) Taylor Songer Collection provides the researcher with a personal view of early Corona history. Emma Josephine “Ocie” Taylor Songer was the daughter of Corona founder Robert B. Taylor and Emma Mason Taylor. Born on July 5, 1877 in Indiana, Ocie was the youngest of three children: James DuVergne Taylor, better known as Verne (b. 4/18/1875, d. 10/4/1919), and Harry Garfield Taylor (b. 6/7/1881, d. 11/11/1903). The Taylor family moved to Anaheim, California in January of 1886 and within a month, R.B. Taylor joined with several others to purchase desert land, first known as “South Riverside” and eventually known as “Corona.” Ocie married Clark E. Songer, a local barber, and had one daughter, Lucille Songer Brown (b.8/1/1911 d. 11/28/1982). She died in 1971 in Villa Park, California.

Collection consists of manuscripts, artifacts, pamphlets, photographs, mementos, souvenirs, reel to reel tapes, a copy of the South Riverside Bee newspaper, and a family scrapbook. The items date from the 1880s to 1979 and present the researcher with a personal view of early Corona history. For best results, this collection should be used in conjunction with the Robert B. Taylor Manuscript Collection (M002). Information on Emma Ocie Taylor and family are contained therein. Some of the items in the collection have been photographed or scanned and are available to view via the Corona Public Library website in our online digital database, *Corona Heritage Online*.
